The context - Nurturing entrepreneurial skillsets and building student startups

â

- Early stage entrepreneurship training programmes
- Entrepreneurship training for doctoral students
- Business incubation programme
- Start-up/Innovator visa scheme
- Mentoring scheme programme
- Base KX centre physical space and community

Last year's outcomes (2019-2020)

- Newly registered companies 64
- New jobs created 129
- Start-ups who have survived at least three years 128

â (

- Annual Revenue of all active firms £47,7m
- Investment raised by Hatchery start-ups £43,8m

Start-up Visa scheme – some data

- Started in 2015 6 endorsements
- 2019/20 44 endorsements
- 2020/21 38 endorsements
- Currently 69 start-ups in our Hatchery (33 Start-up Visa holders)

Higher demand due to increased capacity and active engagement

Start-up Visa – how it works

- Start-up visa information sessions must attend
- Two meetings with an Entrepreneurship Advisor
- Application prepared if given the go-ahead
- Training offered to those who are not ready
- Two deadlines during the year March and September

- Applications assessed by a 3 member panel with a moderator on stand-by
- Two stage application process
 - 4 minute video
 - Business feasibility Plan

Future plans

• Innovator Visa endorsing body achieved in 2021

â

- Engagement to continue for 5 years
- Post start-up visa support
- Process may change keep the 2 stages, but
 - Video and BFP
 - Presentations
- Demand may increase BREXIT
- May want to encourage particular sectors
- Keep reviewing the process and align with overall direction of travel

Some tips

- Clear guidelines
- Early engagement with potential candidates
- Appropriate training before applying
- Active feedback during the engagement
- Close monitoring and support all visa holders are part of the Hatchery

- Training when joining the Hatchery
- Dedicated Entrepreneurship Advisor
- Formal reviews at 6 and 12 months
- Record keeping
